This matter comes before the undersigned as to the exemption from electronic public access fees for the Internal Revenue Service; and


IT APPEARING to the court that the Judicial Conference, at its March 14, 1995, session approved the addition of an advisory note to the miscellaneous fee schedules promulgated under 28 U.S.C. §§ 1913, 1914, 1926, and 1930, for the purpose of clarifying the judiciary's policy with respect to granting provisions from electronic public access fees prescribed under those schedules;

IT FURTHER APPEARING to the Court that pursuant to Local Rules 6.3, 6.4 and 6.6, a copy of every Chapter 11, 12 and 13 petition, lists and schedules should be provided to the Clerk's Office for submission to the Internal Revenue Service;


IT FURTHER APPEARING to the Court that an exemption from the electronic public access fees for the Internal Revenue Service for the sole purpose of reviewing petitions, lists and schedules would allow the Internal Revenue Service to obtain electronic petitions, lists and schedules in lieu of paper documents; now therefore,

IT IS ORDERED THAT, effective immediately, the Internal Revenue Service be exempt from payment of the electronic public access fees prescribed by 28 U.S.C. § 1930 (b) for the sole purpose of reviewing petitions, lists and schedules in cases filed in the Western District of Kentucky.
